DC3 Pacific focuses on operating an advanced digital forensics laboratory at the Atsugi Naval Air Facility, Japan, advancing cyber analysis and information sharing, supporting bilateral engagements, and delivering tailored cyber training through the DC3 Cyber Training Academy. These combined efforts directly strengthen the Pacific Deterrence Initiative and enhance regional cyber resilience.
