## CTA FACT SHEET




DC3 Cyber Training Academy (CTA) is a Department of Defense (DoD) organization dedicated to developing and delivering high-quality cyber training to DoD personnel.

The Academy confers DoD certificates in Incident Response, Digital Forensics and Cyber Crime Investigator.

The CTA public site, DCITA.edu, is the gateway to our Portal, a dynamic resource-rich distance learning platform providing an abundance of formal and informal learning opportunities, from online courses and webinars to blogs and tutorials.

CTA offers more than two dozen cyber courses in several categories of specialization for the Law Enforcement and Counterintelligence (LE/CI), Intel, Cybersecurity, Cyber Mission Forces and International communities. The curriculum is divided into three skill levels: fundamentals, intermediate and advanced.

We design courses to align with requirements of the Defense Criminal Investigative Organizations (DCIOs) and Military Department Counterintelligence Organizations (MDCOs), the National Initiative for Cybersecurity Education (NICE), the DoD Cyber Workforce Framework (DCWF) and the Joint Cyberspace Training and Certification Standards (JCT&CS).

# TRAINING

**CYBERCAST WEBINARS** — CyberCasts are one-hour webinars that feature Academy instructors presenting on a range of current cyber topics such as demonstrations of new software, guidance on cutting-edge techniques, and exploration of emerging threats and technologies.

**COLLEGE CREDIT** — Several Academy courses are recommended for college credit by the American Council on Education (ACE), the major national coordinating body for postsecondary education. In addition, CTA has articulation agreements with 16 colleges and universities that are part of the National Centers for Digital Forensics Academic Excellence (CDFAE), which CTA chairs, with reciprocal college credits. **CONTINUING EDUCATION** — The Academy coursework earns continuing unit credits, or CEUs, toward the DoD Directive 8140 requirements and certification maintenance.

**PERSONAL LEARNING MANAGEMENT** — The Portal's learning management capability makes it easy for students to organize and track their training accomplishments. Using the customizable My Learning page, student and their training POCs can monitor coursework progress and review learning history.
